

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Playwork was invented as a unique way of working with children on the adventure playgrounds set up in the UK just after the Second World War. Since the 1960s, playwork has been used in an increasing number of diverse settings around the world, including earthquake disaster zones in Japan, working with children with disabilities in Fiji, orphanages in Romania and kindergartens in Hong Kong.



Historical research by Dr Shelly Newstead found that the practice of playwork was originally invented to compensate children for the presence of adults on adventure playgrounds. Grounded in the original philosophy of the adventure playground pioneers, the **PARS** model enables practitioners working in any setting to make decisions about whether and how to compensate children for the presence of adults in their time and space. PARS playwork practice is an ideal response for practitioners working in supervised settings who are concerned about shrinking childhoods and the loss of children's freedom.

Focus on...Smartkidz Cambridge, UK

Smartkidz has embedded the PARS model across its three after school clubs through training and mentoring for its whole staff team. One manager currently holds the record for the most PARS Masterclasses attended - three so far! Smartkidz is developing policies based on the PARS model and planning training for parents to help them understand the PARS approach in their settings.

PARS TRAINING

PARS Masterclass

A **PARS** Masterclass is an intensive course delivered by Dr Shelly Newstead, founder of **PARS** playwork practice. The Masterclass covers...

- A brief international history of adventure playgrounds and playwork
- The original philosophy of the adventure playground pioneers and how this is applied in **PARS** playwork practice.
- An overview of the PARS model and explanation of how it can be used to articulate, develop and evaluate playwork practice
- In-depth exploration of PARS theories, methods and techniques and how to apply them
- Discussion of case studies and 'real-life' video clips to enable participants to apply the whole PARS model to their work with children
- A field trip (where possible) to enable participants to reflect on their understanding of the PARS model.



PARS Practicals

PARS Practicals is a one day training course for all staff working in settings where managers have completed a PARS Masterclass. PARS Practicals embeds the PARS model across the whole staff to ensure consistency of practice in the setting.

Focus on... PARS Shanghai

PARS Licensed Trainer Caron Qian (钱铮) first learnt about PARS in Hong Kong in 2015. Since then, Caron has been working to introduce PARS to mainland China, working with local NGOs to deliver training workshops in many different parts of China, including rural kindergartens. Following a PARS Masterclass in December 2017, Caron supported some of the new PARS Practitioners to run a Play Day in an outdoor woodland setting in Shanghai - much to the children's delight!
